●Application Requirements *Each applicant may only compete in <u>one category</u>.

Category I (Speech Contest for Exchange Students):

Applicants for Category I have to meet the following 3 requirements.

- \bigcirc Non-Japanese National, whose mother tongue is not Japanese
- ② Resident of Kitakyushu City / Student of an Educational Institute (University, Junior College, Technical College etc.) / Student of a Japanese Language School located in Kitakyushu City.
- ③ Person that has not received any awards from any of the past "Speech Contest for Exchange Students" conducted by the Kitakyushu International Association.

Category 2 (Oshaberi Speech Contest):

Foreigners living in Kitakyushu City or the surrounding municipalities

- 2 No submission of script that was used in other speech contest(s)
- ③ Speech must be prepared so as to end within 3 minutes, in the 1000 character range (Those unable to write in any Japanese characters, may use *Romaji* in the 300-400 word range)
- ④ Title must be written on the script

●Judging Criteria

Category I (Speech Contest for Exchange Students)

- (I) Contents
- $(\bigcirc$ Are the contents and flow of the speech made in an easy to understand manner?
- ② Does the speech clearly represent the thoughts of the contestant to listeners?
- (2) Expression
- \bigcirc Voice and gesture, facial expression and other means used to convey thoughts.
- 2 Pronunciation, accent, grammar.
- (3) Q&A session: Is the contestant able to answer questions from the judges?
- (4) Time limit: Points will be deducted if the speech over exceeds or is significantly shorter than the 3 minute time limit.

Category 2 (Oshaberi Speech Contest)

- (I) Contents
- ① Does the speech clearly represent the thoughts of the contestant to listeners?
- 2 Are the contents and flow of the speech made in an easy to understand manner?
- (2) Pronunciation, accent: Is the speech easy to understand based on the contestant's pronunciation and accent?
- (3) Expression: Voice and gesture, facial expression and other means used to convey thoughts.
- (4) Time limit: Points will be deducted if the speech over exceeds or is significantly shorter than the 3 minute time limit.
